Actions:

- Initiate a new procurement
- Invest \$195M in our CBOs
- Pay higher provider rates
- Set higher staff salaries

- Invest \$136M to add 20,000
- Focus on K-5 slots
- Start in September 2025
- Focus on families with the highest need


Plan for Universal After-School

Actions:

- Establish NYC Commission for Universal After-School
- Identify key challenges
- Develop solutions
- Draft a strategic plan for phased expansion

Expansion Phased over 3 Years

- K-5 programs are in shortsupply and in demand.
- We are planning for 20,000 new K-5 slots over 3 years, starting in Sept 2025.
- This is the first step towards creating universal access for K-5 programs.
